Annual management fee:

No fee. The underlying fund, the Orbis Global Equity Fund, has its own fee structure. Allan Gray is paid a marketing and distribution fee by Orbis on the underlying Orbis fund.

COMMENTARY

The Fund remains underweight banks based on Orbis' company-by-company fundamental analysis. Orbis' investment process relies on a matrix of analyst teams: national research teams search for attractive stocks by region and global industry teams search by sector.

Working independently, each team distills their research into a handful of their best ideas. When a national analyst and a global industry analyst independently recommend a stock, investment conviction can be higher. Currently, Orbis' research process only finds four banks attractive, Spain's Banco Bilbao Vizcaya Argentaria being the most recent addition to the Fund.


¹ A Total Expense Ratio (TER) is a measure of a portfolio's assets that are relinquished as operating expenses. The total operating expenses are expressed as a percentage of the average value of the portfolio, calculated for the year to the end of June 2010. Included in the TER is the proportion of costs that are incurred by the performance component, fee at benchmark, trading costs (including brokerage, VAT, STT, STRATE and insider trading levy) and other expenses. These are disclosed separately as percentages of the net asset value. A higher TER ratio does not necessarily imply a poor return, nor does a low TER imply a good return. The current TER cannot be regarded as an indication of future TERs. The information provided is applicable to class A units.
