Commentary

Given the geopolitical events of recent months, it may appear foolhardy to invest in emerging markets. But while we recognise that companies in these jurisdictions often come with a higher probability of negative surprises, your Fund may still invest if a stock offers a greater margin of safety. A recent example is Sberbank of Russia. We first looked at Sberbank in mid-2013 but concluded the margin of safety was insufficient. In late 2013 and early 2014, Sberbank shares underperformed and your Fund began to build a position. Very shortly afterwards, the Ukrainian conflict began and the Russian market experienced a sharp sell-off. Against this backdrop, we judged that the stock's risk/reward profile had improved and took advantage of the price decline to increase your Fund's holding to 3.3%. Of course, there is always a large element of subjective judgement, and we often get it wrong, but we find that one's resolve needs to be at its strongest just when popular sentiment is at its weakest.




