## **PORTFOLIO**

#### Commentary

Samsung Electronics has been a significant holding since your Fund's inception in 2006. While we assess investment opportunities with a three- to five-year investment horizon in mind, your Fund can hold shares for much longer periods if they remain attractive. We believe the current weakness in Samsung stock is partly due to the market's fear of the trend towards cheaper commoditised smartphones, a market where Samsung is largely absent. But Samsung has proved that it is capable of quick innovation and, in any case, the company's frequently-overlooked memory chip division already contributes about 28% of earnings before interest and tax. Of course, that is not to downplay the risks. We agree that smartphone margins appear high, but we also note that Samsung trades at just 1.2 times its tangible book value, a level we see as a reasonable margin of safety. While we don't expect overnight change, we do expect that over the long term, Samsung will navigate the challenges placed before it.



#### Value of \$10 invested at inception on 1 January 2006 (dividends reinvested)


