Commentary

Since early 2009, global equity markets have more than doubled—about a 16% annualised return—and 2013 was another robust year. Investors might well worry about what this suggests for prospective returns. However, past market performance in isolation tells us little about future performance. The fact that the market has had a strong move does not, in and of itself, imply that we should expect below-average nominal returns over the next five years. Of course, what matters for your Fund is not the aggregate valuation of the stockmarket as a whole, but the stock selection opportunities within it. While undervalued companies are less plentiful today than they were a few years ago, we have still been able to find pockets of value—such as Korean equities, selected Oil & Gas stocks and shares of companies that are favourably exposed to the prospect of rising interest rates—that we believe offer potential for reasonable risk-adjusted returns.

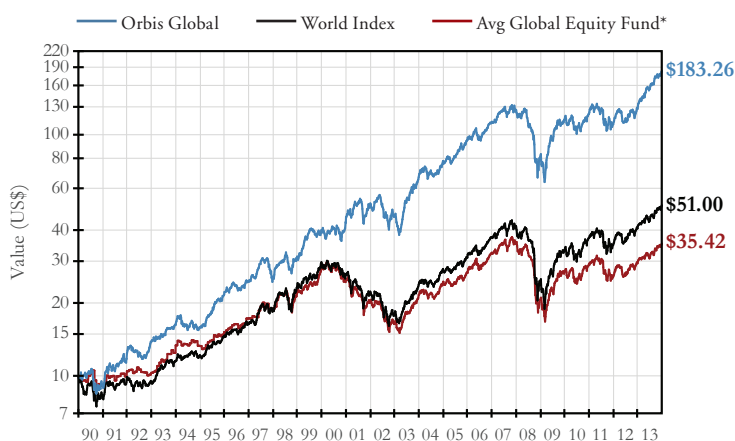

Value of \$10 invested at inception on 1 January 1990 (dividends reinvested)

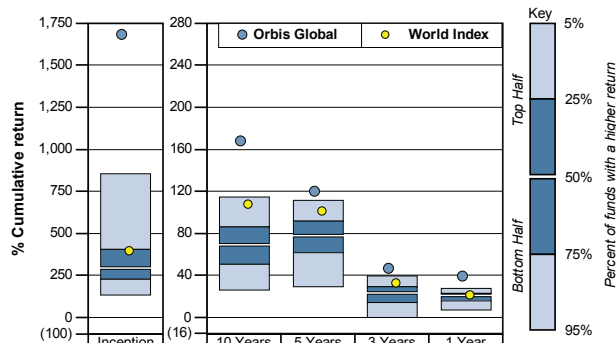
