Commentary

In a year of buoyant equity markets, there are still some companies which have suffered from an onslaught of bad news. Korea Electric Power (KEPCO), your Fund's second-largest holding, has endured regulatory price caps, high commodity input prices, a lack of investable capital and, more recently, very low utilisation of its nuclear generation plants due to maintenance issues. So the announcement in November that the Korean government will allow a 5.4% tariff increase was welcome relief. But while this is indeed good for KEPCO, and helps to confirm our contrarian investment thesis on the company, we see this as just one step in a long journey. In particular, we will continue to pay attention to how management can improve the cost structure by operating new low-cost power generators and how Korea will reform its electricity industry. Informed monitoring of these developments is every bit as important a part of our investment research process as making the initial decision to buy or sell.

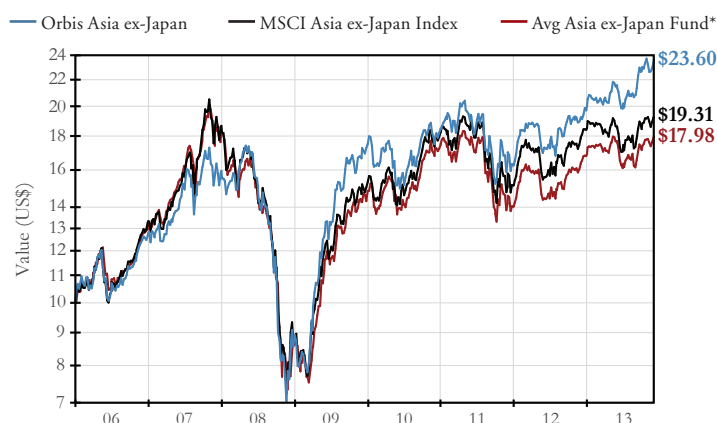

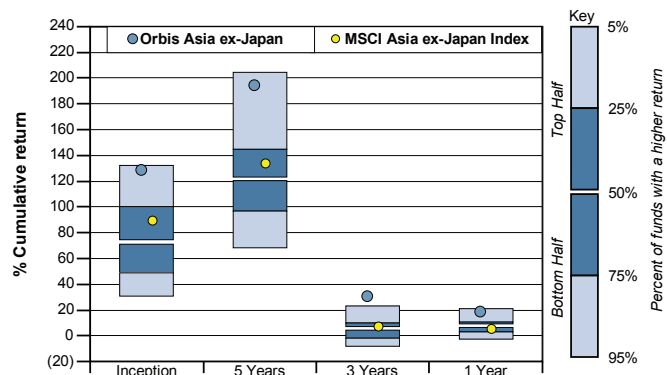
