PORTFOLIO

Commentary

Every investor needs to weigh their need for return against their capacity for loss and the length of time they can remain invested. In Global Balanced, we aim for a happy medium, targeting long-term capital appreciation with less volatility and risk of loss than a pure equity fund. One method to achieve this "balance" is to allocate fixed portions of the portfolio to equities and to bonds, with the rationale that bonds tend to do well when equity markets suffer, and vice versa. We prefer a more flexible approach. In our view, it's not what percentage of your portfolio is in bonds or equities that matters most—but which bonds, and which equities. Rather than determining asset class weightings that we then fill up with holdings, we find individually attractive securities across asset classes, allowing every equity, fixed income, and commodity idea to compete for your Fund's capital. Weighing relationships among these assets, we then combine them to build a portfolio that we believe has the best potential to deliver on your Fund's mandate.

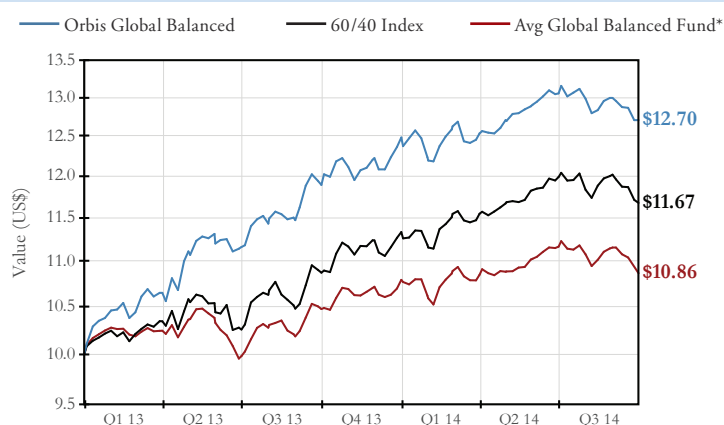

Fund Information

The Benchmark is a composite index consisting of the MSCI World Index with net dividends reinvested (60%) and the JP Morgan Global Government Bond Index (40%).

Net Equity is Gross Equity minus stockmarket hedging.
